Pionnier du journalisme automobile en Inde, Gautam Sen fonde en 1986 India Auto, premier magazine indien spécialisé puis, en 1993, Auto India, rapidement en tête des ventes, l'édition indienne de Auto Motor und Sport, puis celle de Top Gear. Il vit aujourd'hui entre Paris et Bombay, où il dirige Auto India. Ecrivain (Joyaux Automobiles des Maharadjahs, Marcello Gandini : Maestro of Design), Gautam Sen apporte au jury de Chantilly Arts & Elegance Richard Mille les connaissances d'un juge de culture très différente.

Gautam Sen is reputed to be the leading automotive journalist and writer in India, having founded the country's first automotive magazine in 1986. Then, in 1993, Auto India became India's best-selling car magazine. Later, he launched the Indian editions of Auto Motor und Sport and Top Gear. Since 2007, back in the driver's seat at Auto India, he has divided his time between Paris and Mumbai. Sen has written several books including The Maharajas & Their Magnificent Motor Cars and the award-winning Marcelo Gandini: Maestro of Design.
